




March is Women's History Month, and this year we pay honor to the work of all of our professional working women of AFM Local 47.


# Member Spotlight: Alanis Morissette

Known for her emotive mezzo-soprano voice and confessional songwriting, Canadian-American musician, singer, songwriter and actress Alanis Morissette began her career in Canada in the early 1990s with two mildly successful dance-pop albums. In 1995, as part of a recording deal, she moved to Los Angeles and released "Jagged Little Pill," an alt rock-oriented album with the elements of post-grunge, which sold more than 33 million copies globally and is her most critically acclaimed work to date. This earned her Grammy Award for Album of the Year in 1996 and was made into a rock musical of the same name in 2017, which also earned 15 Tony Award nominations including Best Musical. The album also listed in 2003 and 2020 editions of the Rolling Stone's 500 Greatest Albums of All Time Guide. Her popularity grew significantly in Canada, where the album was certified twelve times platinum and produced four RPM chart-toppers: "Hand in My Pocket," "Ironic," "You Learn," and "Head over Feet." The album was also a bestseller in Australia and the United Kingdom.

Dubbed the "Queen of Alt-Rock Angst" by Rolling Stone, Morissette holds the record of the most No. 1s on the weekly Billboard Alternative Songs chart among any female soloist, group leader or duo member. She has won 7 Grammy Awards, 14 Juno Awards, 1 Brit Award, and has sold more than 75 million records worldwide.



#### PROFESSIONAL MUSICIANS LOCAL 47 AND **EMPLOYERS HEALTH & WELFARE FUND**

The Professional Musicians Local 47 and Employers

Health & Welfare Fund is administered by PacFed

Benefit Administrators. AFM Local 47 negotiates benefits on behalf of our members. The Health & Welfare Trust provides medical, dental, vision, chiropractic, acupuncture, prescription drugs and life insurance to musicians who qualify for benefits based upon contributions received on their behalf in accordance with Local 47 and AFM contracts and

collective bargaining agreements. Eligibility Eligibility for enrollment in the Health & Welfare

Fund is based upon contributions the Fund receives

### on musicians' behalf from Participating Employers.

A Participating Employer, or an Employers' Payroll Designee, has entered into a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) with the Union which calls for contributions to come to the Health & Welfare Fund. All contributions must come from a Participating Employer; musicians may not "self-pay" into the Heath & Welfare Fund. Coverage A musician may qualify at one of three levels: Level A (\$1,500+ contribution), Level B (\$1,200-

\$1,499 contribution), and Level C (\$700-\$1,199

### **PENSION**

### AMERICAN FEDERATION OF MUSICIANS & EMPLOYERS' PENSION FUND (AFM-EPF)

One of the most important benefits your job provides you with is the ability to receive pension benefits when you retire. Even though you can collect Social Security at retirement, your retirement years will be more financially secure if you also receive pension benefits. The American Federation of Musicians and Employers' Pension Fund (AFM-EPF) is a defined benefit multi-employer pension plan for members of the American Federation of Musicians.

Under a collective bargaining agreement with the AFM and its Local unions, or other written agreement acceptable to the Board of Trustees, your employer has agreed to make contributions to a pension fund to provide pension benefits to you and other employees working as musicians. The Pension Fund is operated by the AFM-EPF Board of Trustees, which consists of an equal number of Federation Trustees and Employer Trustees.

You should keep in mind that you are not guaranteed a pension just because a pension fund has been established to which your employer contributes. The Pension Fund has rules about how you begin to participate, how can you earn a right to your pension, how much you might receive and when you can start getting payments, what happens to your pension if you die before or after retirement, and many other issues. 



## William Kraft Former Life Member. Drum Set

9/6/1923 – 2/12/2022

William Kraft, longtime percussionist with the Los An-

geles Philharmonic, composer, conductor and teacher passed away on February 12, 2022.

William Kraft was a member of the Los Angeles Philharmonic for 26 seasons, 20 as principal timpanist. Starting in the 1955/56 season, the first seven seasons were spent as a member of the percussion section. He was also the assistant conductor for three seasons under Zubin Mehta. A prolific composer, he became Composer-in-Residence at the LA Phil from 1981-1985. During this period, he was responsible for the founding and directing of the LA Phil's New Music Group, one of several contemporary music projects envisioned and organized by the then Philharmonic's Managing Director, Ernest Fleischmann. Kraft headed the ensemble from 1981-1985 (he was followed by John Harbison, New Music Advisor and later Composer-in-Residence from 1985-1988, and Steven Stucky, Composer-in-Residence & Consulting Composer for New Music, 1988-2009). Born in Chicago, Illinois, William Kraft studied at Co-

percussion with Morris Goldenberg, timpani with Saul Goodman and conducting with Rudloph Thomas and Fritz Zweig. He was also an active freelance musician while in New York, including playing at the Metropolitan Opera. In 1954, Kraft joined the Dallas Symphony, leaving after one season to move to Los Angeles.

While in Los Angeles, Kraft also organized and directed the Los Angeles Percussion Ensemble, a group responsible for many premieres and recordings of works by composers such as Ginastera, Harrison,

lumbia University under Jack Beeson and Henry Cow-

ell for composition, orchestration with Henry Grant,

Stravinsky and Varèse, among others. As a percussion soloist, he also performed the U.S. premieres of Stockhausen's "Zyklus" and Boulez's "Le Marteau sans maître," as well as a recording of Stravinsky's "Histoire du soldat" under the composer's direction.

His vast number of award-winning compositions included five commissions by the LA Phil, including Andirvieni and Pierrot Mute; soundtracks, including the scores to the films "Psychic Killer" (1975), "Ava-

lanche" (1978), "Bill" (1981) and "Fire and Ice" (1983); and the opera "Red Azalea," amongst others. His works were recorded by all the major labels, including, in 2010, the LA Phil recording on Deutsche Grammophon of his Timpani Concerto No. 1, featuring LA Phil Principal Timpanist Joseph Pereira as soloist with LA Phil Creative Chair John Adams conducting.

From 1991 to 2002, William Kraft served as Chair of the Composition Department and Corwin Professor of Music Composition at the University of California, Santa Barbara, where he was Professor Emeritus up

until 2002.

Williams Kraft is survived by his wife Joan Huang, his son Patrick Kraft and daughter Jennifer Slawta, as well

as six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.


